In the absence of Commissioner Kelley, Mr. Mullin called the meeting to order at 3:04 p.m. and moved to nominate John Drew to act as Chair for this meeting. Ms. Cannon seconded the motion and the vote carried unanimously. Mr. Drew assumed the duties of the Chair.

Those present introduced themselves for the record.

It was moved by Mr. Stonebreaker, seconded by Ms. Cannon and carried unanimously to approve the minutes of meeting held December 3, 2015 as presented.

Mr. Selby provided an update on several issues reported during the previous meeting. The Public Works Director had issued a memorandum stating that a work order had been issued to clear the shoulder of the roads on CR107. He expects it to be completed within the next three weeks. The engineer has recommended not putting a turn out to take pedestrians/users to the road as it relates to Bailey Road issues. Railing issues are still under investigation. Additionally, there is no mechanism in place for existing subdivisions (along CR 107) to install sidewalks. Repairs to the sidewalks and mats on Amelia Concourse have been completed.

As mentioned in a previous meeting, Mr. Selby hopes to prepare an agenda item for consideration at the next meeting regarding initiating internal ADA training for board, Constitutional Officers, and other interested parties. Mr. Stonebreaker reported

that he has attended training and questioned if he could delegate someone in his department to receive similar training as well. There were no objections.

There was no public input.

Mr. Mullin questioned if meeting notices were sent to local organizations representing disabled persons in an effort to hear questions/concerns that may relate to compliance at County facilities. Mr. Selby will research distribution of the notices for future meetings.

Mr. Drew congratulated County officials for their continued effort to timely address ADA issues that may arise and maintain compliance.

With no other business to address, the committee considered the next date to meet. It was moved by Ms. Cannon, seconded by Mr. Stonebreaker and carried unanimously to set the next meeting of the ADA Advisory Committee for Thursday, July 7, 2016 at 3:00 p.m. in the Commission Chambers.

There being no further discussion, the meeting adjourned at 3:13 p.m.
