FY 20/21 Goals

FY 19/20 Accomplishments

- Responded to 9,553 calls for service in calendar year 2019.
- Improved staffing levels on two (2) engines and our one (1) ladder, raising each from current staffing of 2 to 3, moving our department closer to meeting NFPA standards.
- Created a new Fire Marshal position to improve our fire prevention capabilities.
- Began construction of Fire Station 71 at Heron Isles. Estimated completion April 2021.
- Battery powered extrication equipment purchased for each engine company as a Capital Improvement item to provide faster extrication of victims of motor vehicle accidents.
- Adding a vehicle storage building to NCFR HQ property to house our spare vehicles and other equipment in a secure area.
- Placed Tanker 90 in service November 9, 2019. Vehicle purchased as Capital Improvement item.
- Adding a brush truck to the western part of the county at station 90 to provide off-road access to brush fires as well as assistance on major incidents. Vehicle purchased as Capital Improvement item.
- Received State of Florida EMS grant valued at \$8,183.00 for the purchase of eight (8) Automated External Defibrillators.
- Purchased one (1) engine and two (2) rescues as part of Fleet Replacement Program.
- Awarded Assistance to Firefighters Grant-COVID Supplemental valued at \$31,486 for equipment used for decontamination of rescue units

FY 20/21 Goals

- Improve staffing levels on three (3) additional engines, raising each from current staffing of 2 to 3 moving our department closer to meeting NFPA standards.
- Place Engine 71 in service upon completion of the new fire station.
- Work with Three Rivers DRI to begin the process of building a fire station and procure apparatus as indicated by the developer agreement.
- Renew all paramedic and EMT licenses for each of our members.
- Fill all positions as needed.
- Purchase one (1) engine and one (1) rescue as part of Fleet Replacement.
- Continue to maintain and improve community relationships.
- Continue to maintain strong relationships with NCSO and Emergency Management.
